GENERAL EDS

All courses highlighted in **blue** are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be online, blended, web conference, or in-person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

All courses highlighted in **yellow** are only offered in-person. These classes are only day hours and will be one to two days per week.

CLINICAL COURSES

All courses highlighted in **red** are clinical courses. Students will be placed in a day or evening clinical.

Intro to Clinical Practice - Long Term Care Facility: This clinical will be eight weeks and held on Tuesday and Wednesday. It may be day or evening.

Lifespan Clinical – Clinic Setting: This clinical will be day hours and occur Monday through Friday.

Intro to Clinical Care Management: Med/Surg: this clinical will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday. Clinical may be day or evening.

SKILLS COURSES

All courses highlighted in **green** are in person. Students are required to practice outside of scheduled class time and are assigned to a check-off time. Check-off times are scheduled outside of class and required of all students. Nursing Skills is only offered during the day and will be two days per week in person.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

No final grade lower than a “B” is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the course with “B” or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.
