GENERAL EDS

All courses highlighted in blue are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be fully online, blended, online live, or in-person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

All the courses highlighted in yellow are offered online or in-person. The in-person courses will be held in the evening one day per week.



CLINICAL COURSES

All courses highlighted in **red** are clinical courses. Students will be placed in an evening clinical. Clinical courses may be six to eight hour shifts and will be two days per week. Students typically need to set time aside to complete clinical paperwork. Clinicals may start as early as 2:00 P.M. for an evening shift.

Intro to Clinical Care Practice - Long Term Care Facility: This clinical will be eight weeks and held on Wednesday and Thursday. Clinical will be in the evening.

Lifespan Clinical - OB, Community: This clinical will be held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical will be in the evening.

Intro to Clinical Care Management - Med/Surg: This clinical will be the second eight weeks and held on Tuesday and Wednesday. Clinical will be in the evening.

Intermediate Clinical Practice - Med/Surg and Psych. This clinical will be in the evening on Tuesday and Wednesday and run full semester.

Advanced Clinical Practice -Eight weeks of med/surg and simulations: All students go to med/surg the second eight weeks of the semester, and it will be held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical will be in the evening. Simulations will occur after completion of med/surg and will be determined by the clinical instructor.

Transitions - Four week clinical: 90-hour preceptor led clinical that is held at a variety of sites. Students are asked what sites they may be interested in completing this clinical. For this clinical, you will complete your hours during the hours your nurse preceptor is assigned. This could be days, evenings, nights or weekend hours and can be eight to 12 hour shifts.

SKILLS COURSES

All courses highlighted in **green** are in-person. Students are required to practice outside of schedule class time and are assigned to a check-off time. Check-off times are schedule outside of class and required of all students.

Semester One - Nursing Skills is offered in the evening one day per week.

Semester Five - Advanced Skills is offered in the evening one day per week.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

No final grade lower than a "B" is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the course with "B" or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.

IMPORTANT FINANCIAL AID NOTICE

Students who complete all general education courses prior to starting the ADN Part-time program will have difficulties with financial aid eligibility. Financial aid requires that students enroll in at least six credits. If you have completed or will complete all general education courses prior to starting, please make sure to meet with your financial aid and academic advisor to discuss your options.
